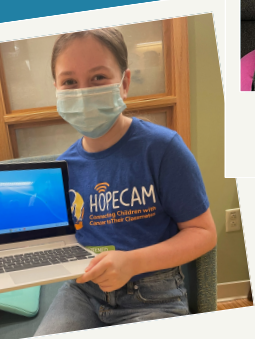

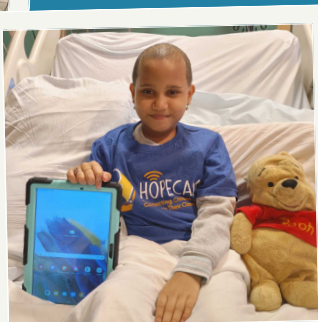

Chairman's Letter

As we look back on the past year, significant moments stand out. We supported **more than 500 courageous children** fighting serious illnesses, literally climbed mountains to advance Hopecam's mission, and created opportunities to help many more children in the future.

Despite challenges—a leaner team of three, new internal structures and communication methods, staff turnover in healthcare that impacted our partnerships with hospitals, and, as a result, a reduction in referrals to Hopecam—we persevered! Through determination, we rebuilt these critical connections, restoring a steady stream of referrals. And, amidst it all, Hopecam got a new and improved look for its brand.

On the programming front, we introduced **Hopecam Hangouts**—virtual pizza parties and tailored experiences to foster meaningful connections for our amazing kids and their friends. Our fundraising events like the annual dinner and 5K race exceeded expectations, and the Mount Everest climb raised an astounding \$500,000!

We'd like to acknowledge three departing Hopecam Board members: Wendy Maiwurm, who provided eight years of executive team leadership, Tim Wendell and Marty Tarr, each serving six-year terms. Our gratitude goes to them for their valuable contributions.

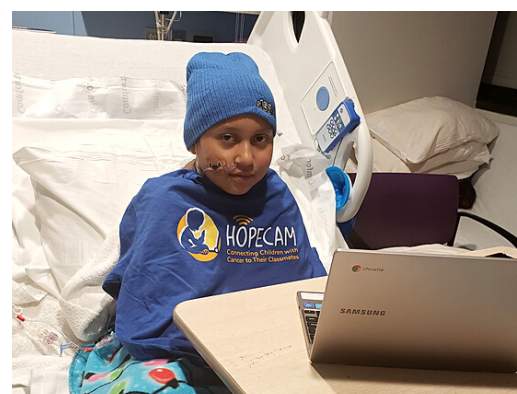
Looking ahead, our goals are clear: establish more classroom connections, expand hospital relationships to new markets, and seek local foundation grants in underserved cities.

About Hopecam

Since 2003, Hopecam has helped pediatric cancer patients conquer social isolation with technology and social programming. As a 501(c)3 organization, Hopecam works with childhood cancer warriors, their families, hospitals, and providers to ensure they stay plugged into a life that feels secure, social, and minimally disruptive.

At no cost to the family, Hopecam provides smart devices, internet access, and virtual events that foster connections, promote healing, boost self-confidence, and raise morale for youth undergoing cancer treatment.

Get in Touch, Stay in Touch

We work with each family to meet their specific requirements. The technology and/or services our families receive typically include **a personal Chromebook or tablet, a Zoom account, a classroom webcam, and virtual programs like Hopecam Hangouts.**

A Hopecam team member will talk with each family to understand their unique circumstances and align on what's needed, together.

Connected When It Matters

School-issued technology (when available) comes with limitations that, outside of school or curriculum learning, prevent children from accessing user-friendly websites, software, and resources that are imperative for social interactions, online therapy, and telehealth services. The technology also must be returned at the end of the school year in May/June.

Hopecam technology, however, empowers children to connect with their classroom, peers, medical providers, friends, and loved ones no matter where they are. Best of all, each child gets to keep their computer or tablet after completing treatment.

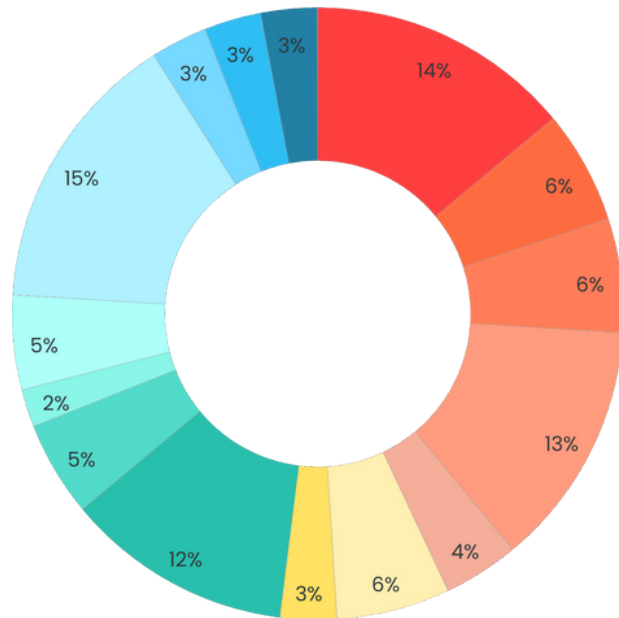

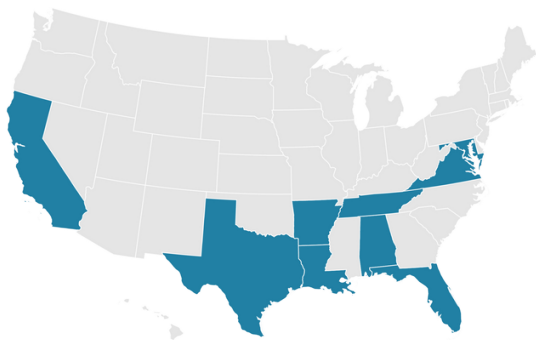

Making Back-to-School Easier for Families

In 2022, Hopecam collaborated with Texas Children's Hospital's Hematology/Oncology Programs on a back-to-school initiative to provide technology support to families of children undergoing treatment at the hospital.

Texas Children's Hospital assessed the needs of its pediatric patients and their families for the upcoming school year. **Hopecam supplied more than 40 children with essential technology**, including laptops, tablets, and hotspots, to facilitate virtual and hybrid learning during their treatment.

Families were provided with guidance on how to effectively use the technology and connect with their schools from home. Hopecam also assisted schools by offering technology support and recommendations for successful connectivity. Additionally, Texas Children's School Specialists received laptops and hotspots to distribute to families, enabling them to use this technology during their hospital treatment.

This partnership between Hopecam and Texas Children's Hospital proved highly successful. Families reported that Hopecam's technology support helped their children stay connected with teachers and classmates, simplifying the process of keeping up with schoolwork.

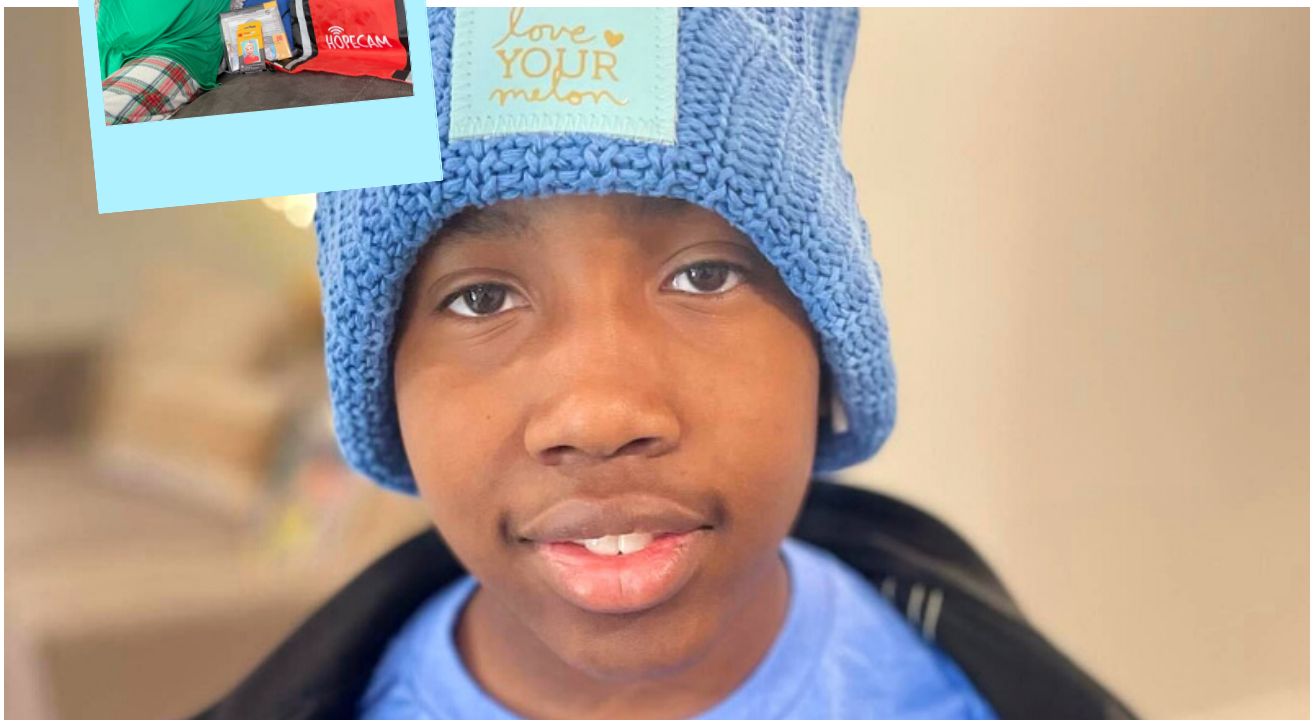


Hopecam Hero Spotlights

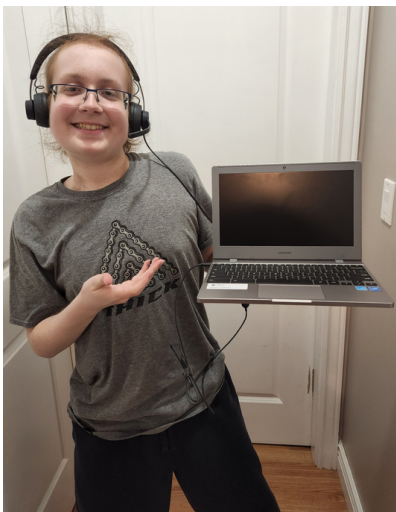

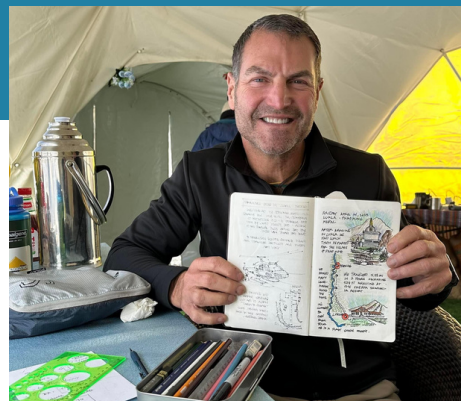

Meta Grant Award



Hopecam’s partnership with Meta grew this year when the technology giant’s Virginia-Henrico Data Center donated 15 Meta portals to help local children with cancer stay connected with their families and friends. The Meta portals, essentially video-calling devices, enable isolated children to socialize and see the faces of important people in their lives, lifting their spirits as they undergo treatment.

In addition to the portals, **Meta contributed \$15,000 to Hopecam**, the third year it has awarded a grant to Hopecam to provide support in the Richmond area. The gift is part of Meta’s annual Data Center Community Action Grants program, which provides direct funding to schools, nonprofits, and community organizations in locations where the company has an operational data center.
